Know Ye, That I William Rufus Putnam appointed Superintendent of the surveys of the Ohio Company, in obedience to a law of the State, entitled "an act to provide for the transcribing the records of the Ohio Company, in the office at Marietta, and to make such copies "evidence in courts of Justice" passed January 30<sup>th</sup> 1818 and an act supplementary thereto passed Feb. 8<sup>th</sup> A. 1819

have carefully compared the foregoing resolutions, act and designs of the Ohio Company, together with the plats and descriptions of lands as therein recorded and transcribed with the original records in the office of the Ohio Company at Marietta; and hereby certify that they are true and faithful copies of the same, and that they contain to the best of my knowledge and judgment all the testimony in said office necessary to preserve and perpetuate the evidence of title of all the original proprietors of the Ohio Company whose lands were located and surveyed within the limits of the County of Hocking; State of Ohio.
