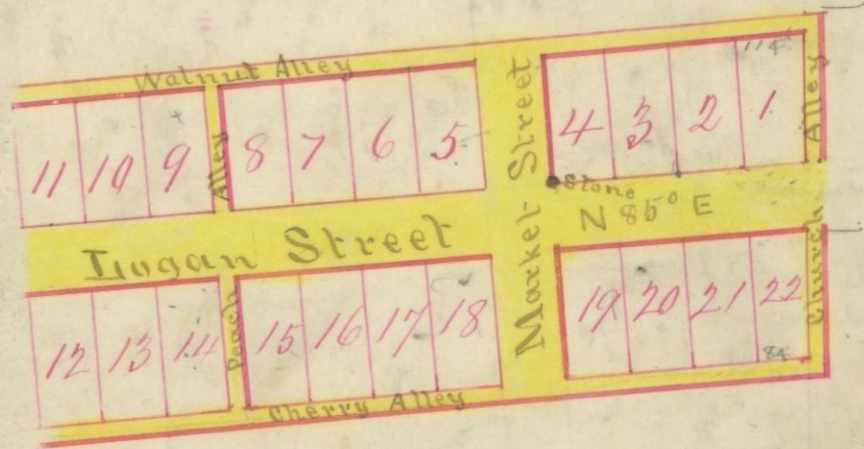

The above is a Plat of Gibsonville in Township 12 Range 18. The town of Gibsonville was surveyed from a part of the east half of the N.E. quarter of Section 21, of said Township, commencing on the S.W. corner of Lot N^o 4, where is a stone, thence N. 85° E. and S. 85° W. each lot being 4 poles in width, and at right angles back S. 5° E. and N. 5° W. eight poles, except Lots 1 and 22 Lot N^o 1 being 114 links on Walnut alley and in front 4 poles Lot N^o 22 being 97 links on Logan Street, eight poles back, and 84 links on Cherry alley, the streets being 4 poles in width and the Alleys one pole in width.
