HAYDENVILLE SIDEWALKS AND PARKS-CONCERNS: Sandy Johnson and Rebecca Starlin from HAP Community Action addressed citizens concerned about the Haydenville Sidewalks and Parks. Sandy reviewed the process and the grant requirements with the citizens. There was much discussion on the Sidewalks and the miscommunication that transpired. Sandy explained that if anyone has any questions to call her or Rebecca. Jeff Maiden with RJM Engineering explained the reasoning that the sidewalk was moved to the canal side. There was concern about the pickup of traffic once the bypass is finished. The Commissioners said that Engineer Bill Shaw is going to perform a speed study to determine if the speed limit should be lowered. There was also concern about the park being finished on time. Sandy assured the citizens that the park will be finished by the end of August and there has been work done to the park.

BID AWARD-HAYDENVILLE PARKS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES: Motion by Greg Green and seconded by Sandy Ogle to award the bid for Haydenville Parks and Recreational Facilities to Good Builders in the amount of \$22,126.00 and to authorize President John Walker to sign the Notice of Award, Contract, Notice to Proceed and Notice of Commencement of Public Improvement. EXECUTIVE SESSION: Motion by Greg Green and seconded by Sandy Ogle to enter into Executive Session at 10:42 am with J&FS Director Bob Smith, Prosecutor Laina Fetherolf, Auditor Ken Wilson, Children Service Director Cathy Hill and Jaqui Stobbs to discuss legal matters. Vote: Ogle, yea, Green, yea, Walker, yea.

EXIT EXECUTIVE SESSION: Motion by Greg Green and seconded by Sandy Ogle to exit Executive Session at 11:43 am, no action taken. Vote: Ogle, yea, Green, yea, Walker, yea.

AUDITOR KEN WILSON-CERTIFICATE OF INDEBTEDNESS: Auditor Ken Wilson presented the Commissioners with a Certificate of Indebtedness to guarantee that the county has the funds to make the appropriate match in the Clean Ohio Revitalization Fund application.

ACCEPT CERTIFICATION AS TO INDEBTEDNESS AND ALLOW GREG GREEN TO SIGN CORF APPLICATION: Motion by Sandy Ogle and seconded by John Walker to accept the Certification as to Indebtedness for the Clean Ohio Revitalization Fund and to allow Greg Green to sign the CORF Application Letter. Vote: Ogle, yea, Green, yea, Walker, yea.

PROSECUTOR LAINA FETHEROLF: Prosecutor Laina Fetherolf answered some questions Sandy had for her. Sandy asked what recourse a county resident would have if her neighbor has chickens that they do not keep pinned and wander into her yard and ruin her landscaping. Laina said that the law says she can shoot the chickens but must reimburse the owner the value of the chicken minus any damages to her property. Sandy asked if the Treasurer can send out the sewer collection notices, Laina said that would be fine. Sandy also asked if a collection agency can charge an additional fee for the sewer collection, Laina said most likely, but will check specifically with sewer bills.

MELANIE OGLE: Melanie Ogle spoke to the Commissioners about the possible towers that will go up if broadband is brought into the county. She gave the Commissioners an information packet to read and explained some of the aesthetic problems with towers but also the health effects. She asked that they read and consider this information before they endorse a broadband plan.

SEWER LOAN: The Commissioners discussed the possibility of taking out a sewer loan for Unsewered Area Planning. Sandy said that she does not want to borrow any money at this time. Greg added that he has contacted the Voinovich Center to see if they can help with this type of planning. He continued to say that the sewer district has over \$27,000 in delinquent bills and doesn't feel they should do it. All agreed it is a good idea and may take the opportunity if it comes along again at a better time.
