In the past, they have been purchased from the Maintenance budget, but Greg feels they should be purchased from Permanent Improvement from now on because they have a estimated life of 5 years or more. Auditor Ken Wilson says they should continue to be paid from the Maintenance budget and John agrees. Greg said that Ken told him that it should be treated like a computer, so Greg feels if that is the case then each department should be responsible for paying for their window air conditioners. Sandy said that the procedure needs to change.

AUDITOR KEN WILSON: Auditor Ken Wilson spoke to the Commissioners about the new Employee Assistance Program Provider and gave a financial report for the month of July. John and Sandy spoke to Ken about the window air conditioners. Sandy said she feels they should come from permanent improvement because they last approximately 5 years. Ken said that it is personal property, not a fixture and it's not a property improvement, so he doesn't feel it can be considered a permanent improvement. He said it has never been a question and not sure why it is now. John said he didn't feel they should change it if it worked in the past.

He explained that they have seen an increase in the past couple of years due to the Hospitals Summit, which is a behavioral health unit for senior citizens. He commended the availability of The Summit, but acknowledged that the services of guardians need to be compensated. He requested that he be allowed to transfer funds from his computerization fund to his indigent guardianship fund. This can only be done with a court order because these funds are set up for specific uses. The Commissioners have no problem with the transfer. The Judge said he will have the proper paperwork submitted.
