BELINDA MODER:

Hocking County Resident Belinda Moder asked for clarification on the reorganization of the Dog Warden to the Sheriff's Department. Commissioner Ogle said there is a full-time deputy with the Sheriff's Department and the dogs are in the care of the Humane Society.

Ms. Moder had additional questions regarding the future plans for the dog shelter. Commissioner Ogle said they are in an eighteen month contract negotiation with the Humane Society. Renovations will continue at the dog shelter.

Ms. Moder said she does not feel moving the dogs to kennels with plastic tarps and outdoor grounds is sufficient housing. She is concerned with protocol at the Humane Society. Ms. Moder continued to ask questions related to the Humane Society.

Ms. Moder read the handbook of Ohio County Commissioners Association of Ohio that states a written agreement with the Sheriff's Office must be made at the first Commissioners Meeting of the calendar year. Mr. Fickel said there is no written agreement.

Ms. Moder asked if animals were being housed at the county shelter. Major Moritz responded the School Resource Office answered a dog complaint and the deputy was unaware of the new protocols in place. Major Moritz said they made contact with the Fairfield County Dog Warden and he is helping with the training and protocols for the new dog warden.

Janelle Voorhees said her first question is on transparency. She said she understands the commissioners don't make decisions in executive session; however, the commissioners were not forthright in telling them what their plans were. She said they were not informed on what the commissioners were doing.

Commissioner Ogle said she does not recall that in all the years she's been here that they notify the people in detail why they are going into executive session. Ms. Voorhees said they went into executive session with the Humane Society and came out with drastic actions which were not presented. It was not discussed with the public.

Ms. Moder commented the meeting minutes from May 24th make Brian Wyksiver the point of contact for the project. She asked if he has received any estimates. Commissioner Dickerson said not that he has been made aware of. Ms. Moder said she provided a list, and asked why it hadn't been approached. The commissioners said there were no phone numbers provided.

John Stradaskey asked if it was the intention of the commissioners to renovate the dog shelter to put the dogs back in. Commissioner Ogle said at this point they can't say, because the contract is for 18-months. John said he shows up every week because he sees this is an issue, and the commissioners are the ones who can resolve the issue. He has seen what has been posted online and thinks it's detestable. John believes in mutual respect.
