## **COMMISSIONERS MEETING AUGUST 15, 2019**

Hocking County Resident Ms. Roszell explained to the commissioners that her neighbor moved six junk vehicles to their property line adjacent to her Lot 28. Ms. Roszell commented she needs help because she needs to sell the land.

Commissioner Ogle said with no zoning in the county that creates a problem. What Commissioner Ogle has done in the past is talk to the Health Department.

Ms. Roszell commented if the vehicles led paint corroded that could affect the water of whoever builds a house on the property. Commissioner Ogle suggested she talk to Mr. Fisher the Health Commissioner.

The commissioners and Ms. Roszell discussed zoning code, which is the responsibility of each township.

### **BEN FICKEL:**

Prosecutor Fickel said the most recent discussion with Neopost was with the account manager who was asking for more information on the problems. On Tuesday he got an email that we are 300 days past due. They did not take anything into consideration that we set them, which Mr. Fickel does not agree with.

Commissioner Ogle asked Mr. Fickel what they should do next. Mr. Fickel said he did not know.

Commissioner Dickerson said bring it on and see what it is they want to do.

Mr. Fickel said if we can't convince them they are in the wrong, the next step is a judge or a jury.

### **SCENIC HILL SENIOR CENTER:**

Commissioner Ogle presented documents for the President of Board to sign from the Scenic Hills Senior Center. It is an agreement between the Athens Hocking Vinton 317 Board and the Scenic Hills Senior Center.

### **INDUSTRIAL SHREDDER:**

Commissioner Ogle and Commissioner Dickerson discussed the City of Logan using the county paper shredder.

Commissioner Ogle suggested they pay a flat rate of \$500 per year and the county would train a city employee to shred. They would also be responsible to dispose of the paper.

Jake Turner suggested the commissioner dispose of the shredder paper in Columbus.

Commissioner Dickerson suggested they put the money collected into a maintenance repair fund. Only trained personnel should be allowed to use it.

The commissioners clerk suggested they show proof of insurance.

Motion by Sandra Ogle and seconded by Jeff Dickerson.

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Commissioner Ogle commented she went to the homeless shelter today (Thursday) and said there is one thing that needs corrected. She would like to send a letter to Mr. Bletchley. There is standing water at the end of the bank, if there is hard rain the place will be flooded because it has nowhere to go.
