APPOINTMENTS

EMA

EMA Director Bozz Salizzoni presented the Commissioners with an update on the County, projected the State of Emergency to be released tomorrow (02/11). Currently all AEP customers should be without power and only 290 South Central Power customers remain with no electricity. There are currently 300 linemen in the County working to restore those customers. Commissioner Ogle asked if all County roads are open, and Bozz replied yes, with the exception of 2 or 3 that could still be a concern. Commissioner Dickerson complimented EMA on their terrific communication and organization. Bozz thanked the Commissioner and said that it is nice to know that everyone can come together and work well. Commissioner Ogle asked if there would be an exit meeting, and Bozz replied that there will be an after action report that will highlight the strong areas and the pinch point areas that need work.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Sue Morgan asked about dead trees, and if a homeowner is responsible to clear those up. Bozz replied to Sue Morgan stating that if the dead trees are within a right of way then the Engineer can take those down, if there are not, then they will contact the homeowner to take care of those. A lot of the down trees were not in the right of way, which made the clean up process longer. Commissioner Ogle and Bozz discussed that a lot of the down lines and trees on lines were in State right of way areas, some poles required a mile hike to get to. EMA instructed those with questions or concerns to reach out to the EMA office.

Health Department

Kevin Smith from the Hocking County Health Department presented the Commissioners with bids for contracts #2021-007 and #2021-008.

Motion by Sandra Ogle and seconded by Jeff Dickerson to award WPCLF Contract #2021*007 to J.C. Excavating, for the amount of \$12,200.00 and permitting fees in the amount of \$375.00 for a total contract amount of \$12,575.00.

ABM

John Ferragonio and Tyler Nichols are back with a revised Master Agreement. After some clarification, IT Director Mark Stout directed Commissioner Ogle to the back page of the agreement, where the amendments have taken place. This agreement now entails the alert notification systems, HVAC, elevator work, and the fire escapes. Commissioner Dickerson commented that the Prosecutor's office does need the work done, considering the historical status of that building. Mark discussed that the \$49,000.00 agreement ensured the Commissioners to the Engineer specs and plans with ABM, which would cost \$49,000.00 with another outside source to draw up those plans. Commissioner Dickerson asked Mark Stout if he was comfortable with the Commissioners signing and agreeing to the Master Agreement, and Mark replied yes. The Prosecutor has reviewed and approved the agreement, prior to some change of language. Commissioner Ogle discussed her concerns, once projects are laid out with costs the Commissioners selected certain projects to move forward with and abandoned other projects due to low funds. John and Tyler both reassured Commissioner Ogle that the selection process can be done.
