PUBLIC COMMENT

Nathan Andrews commented that he feels that this would be a poor decision for the auto camp - because of concerns about traffic, roadways worsening, destroying trees and land, internet, and increased volume of unknown individuals in the area. Mr Andrew already has a problem with people pulling and backing out of his driveway. He also feels there is going to be more drugs.

Pat Harman feels that we need to have the opinion of the people, there needs to be more residential properties. She foresees property closing in the next 12-18 months due to the interest rate going up. Pat said that we need more younger people here in our community because we don't have the sense of community.

Donna Garner talks about how her property taxes have gone up the last couple of years. Donna said where she lives that people can not afford property taxes and these cabin owners want to buy their land and they accept because they can no longer afford the taxes.

Donna is concerned about people backing in and out of her driveway and it would take a while for the Sheriff to get there, which is a safety concern. Donna would like to see property taxes not continue to rise.

Jamie Riggs said that she likes the fact that the community can come and talk to the Commissioners. Jamie is concerned about all the Tourism that is coming to Hocking County and she feels that they could care less about our town. Jamie wants to know how we can have a public meeting and address the issue and try to resolve them and make things better again. Her and her husband have been involved in the 4H and with the community. She felt that a lot of people knew about this and didn't tell the public (Auto Camp).

Jamie asked if she could ask a question for Sue Morgan, she was unable to attend. Sue's question was in the meeting Jeff had said that he had a meeting with John Rosen the Friday before and that they were going to have Karen Raymore come. Karen Raymore did not attend the meeting and the letter was signed. Sue wanted to know who talked to Gary about when they talked about and when Jeff and Gary decided to sign the letter of support because the decision was not made at the meeting.

Donna Garner stated that her mom and dad bought the property where she resides. She wants to keep it and make a memorial for her parents before something happens to her and with the taxes going up she feels that she may not be able to do that for them.

Nathan Andrews

Nathan Andrews feels that Jon Rosen is not a person to be doing business with. Nathan feels he is fishy with different layers.

When you get grant money there are always some kind of strings attached to it.

Gary commented that we do represent your interest. Gary said that he understands a lot more now then he did.

Pat Harman talked about seeing if we could set up a house trust with funds so that as the property value goes up, so that we can keep people living in Hocking County.

Jamie Riggs wants to bring things back into the community. She agreed with what everyone had said today in the meeting. She wants to bring it back into the community, committed to the land and the 4-H. She said that she wants to go to the state, she feels that some of the issues are out of the Commissioner's hands. They need to change things through legislation.
