9:30 - Laurelville FIre Chief Butch Valentine presented a letter he wrote last August to State Senators and State Representatives of Ohio regarding a request for a 3% increase on the bed tax to help cover the rising costs of operating Fire and EMS safety services brought by the large number of tourists visiting the area. Chief Valentine asked if the Prosecutor had reviewed the letter and approved it.

Commissioner Linton informed Chief Valentine that even though his letter didn't get through, we are working on an amendment to the operating budget for the State biennial budget to add a certain percentage to the County bed tax to support safety services.

Chief Valentine discussed the increase in rental cabins, the increase monetarily for the year. Camping sites that are coming in, and a facility on the edge of town.

Chief Valentine discussed the amount of runs that were done and the amount of people to do the job with a 77% increase last year in runs.

Chief Valentine also asked about the Landbank and the Nursing Home demo in Laurelville.

Commissioner Linton stated that at the end of March there will be a push to establish a Landbank.

9:57 - AFLAC Benefits Advisor Anthony Thompson presented to the Commissioners the AFLAC Benefits options available to the County. He informed that 82 out of 88 counties are enrolled in this program. Commissioner Linton asked if a survey could be done to gauge the interest in the program. Mr Thompson said that yes he could do a survey. The Commissioners agreed that a survey should be done. Commissioner Linton asked to table the subject for a month and reschedule Mr. Thompson.

Commissioner D'Onofrio stated that there have been no discussions yet but he will talk with Chief Bickel and have information next week.

Ward township Trustee Mike Kinneer said that ward township is 80% percent Wayne National Forest and their tax base is nil based on new construction. And were are hoping the County would pay for the paving.
