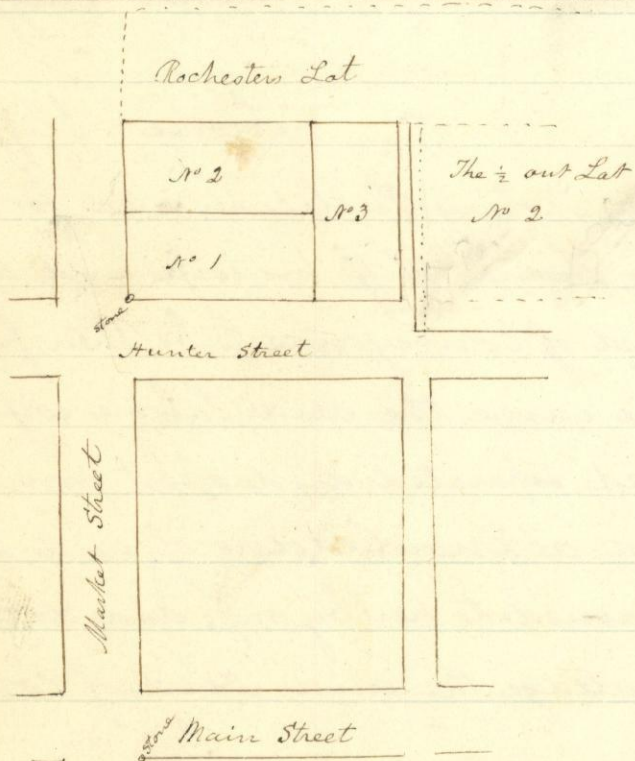

Frazee's Addition to Logan

The above is a plat of a division of the West half of out Lot No Two as designated on the original Plat of the Town of Logan in Hocking County Ohio commencing at a stone 28 poles North and one pole West (with the variation) of a stone on N E corner of Market and Main Streets Lots No 1 and 2 being 74 feet 3 inches fronting Market Street and at right angles back 160 feet 6 inches Lot No 3 being 74 feet 3 in fronting Hunter

Street and at right angles back 148 feet 6 in. Hunter Street 66 feet in width the alley between Market and Mulberry 8 feet 3 in June 15th 1839. I certify the above to be a correct copy from my Docket
