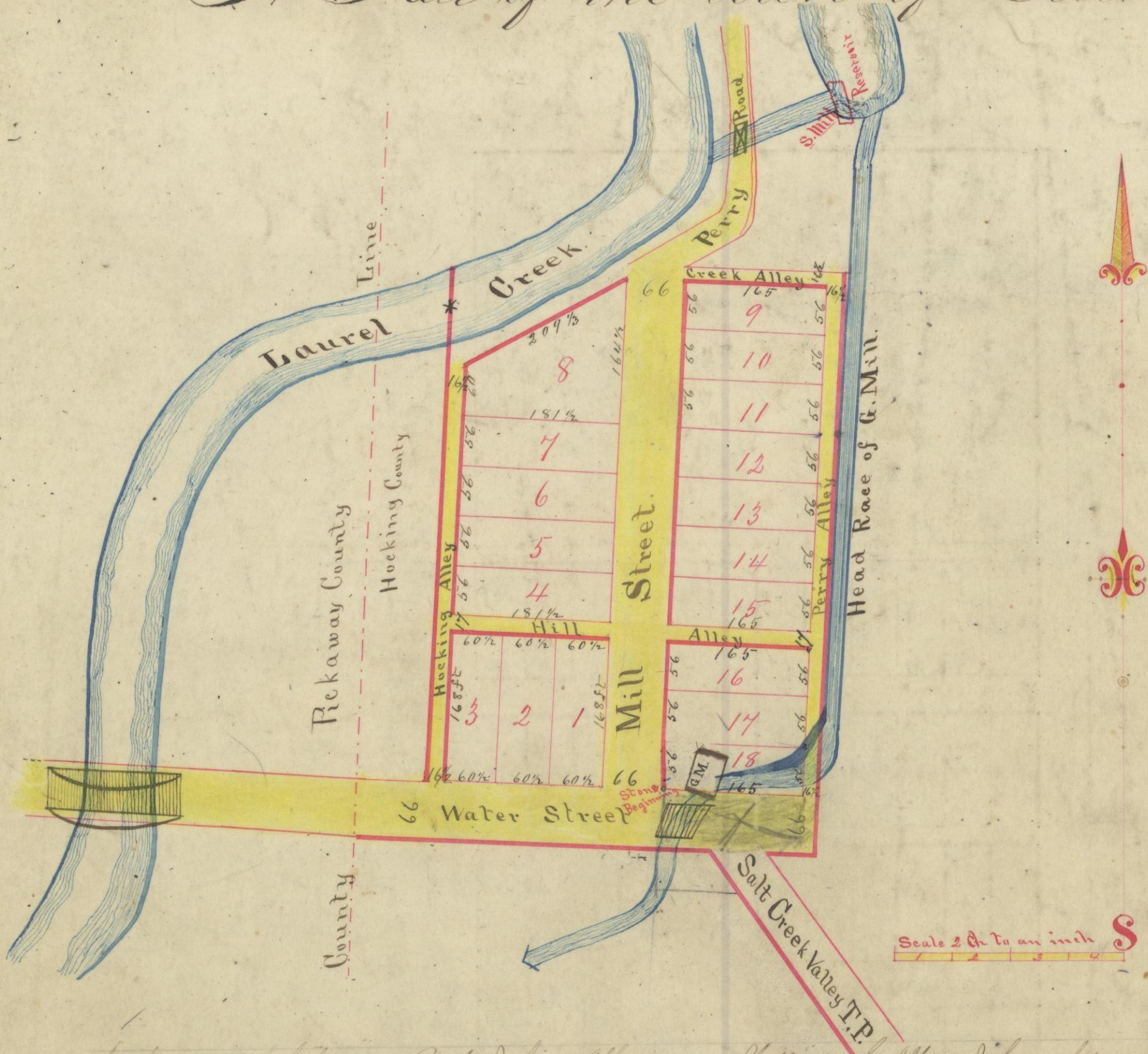


# A Plat of the town of Laurelville

At the request of Solomon Riggle, John Albin and William S. Albin, I have laid out a town in the west half of section No. 31. Township No. 12. Range No. 19. to be known by the name of Laurelville. I began at a point from which the North west corner of the West Mill now owned by John and William S. Albin bears N. 26 3/4° E. 101 links distant at which point I placed a large stone, eight inches below the surface of the earth, from which future surveys can be made. I then laid out Mill Street said stone being the south east corner of said Mill Street N. 3 1/2° E. 593 1/2 ft in length and 66 ft in width. I then laid out Water Street beginning at the South East corner of Mill Street thence running N 87° West 264 feet in length and 66 feet wide. I then laid out Hocking Alley beginning at a point in the north line of Water Street 181 1/2 feet N 87 1/2° W from the west line of Mill Street and parallel thereto 452 feet in length and 16 1/2 feet wide. I then laid out Perry Alley beginning at a point N 87° E 165 feet from the south east corner of Mill Street and parallel to said Street N 3 1/2° E. 593 1/2 feet in length and 16 1/2 feet wide. I then laid Hill Alley beginning at a point in the east line of Hocking Alley N 3 1/2° E from the north line of Water Street and parallel to said Water Street 412 1/2 feet to the west line of Perry Alley and 17 feet wide. I then laid out creek alley beginning at a point in the east line of Mill Street N 3 1/2° E 57 1/2 feet from Hill Alley running parallel to Hill Alley S 87 1/2° E 165 feet to Perry Alley and 16 1/2 feet wide. I then laid out 18 lots to be numbered from one to eighteen consecutively. Lots Nos 1, 2 and 3 front each 60 1/2 feet on Water Street and extend back N 3 1/2° E 163 feet to Hill Alley. Lots Nos 4, 5, 6 and 7 front each 56 feet on Mill Street and extend back N 87° W to Hocking Alley. Lot No 8 fronts 164 1/2 feet on Mill Street and extends along the line of Lot No 7, 181 1/2 feet to Hocking Alley, and along Hocking Alley 60 feet. Lots Nos 9 and 10 front each on Mill Street and extend back S 87 1/2° E 165 feet to Perry Alley. Lots Nos 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 18 front each on Mill Street and extend back S 87 1/2° E 165 feet to Perry Alley. D. N. Sweetman, Surveyor of Rekaway County O. October 18th 1871. State of Ohio Hocking County ss. - Before me Daniel S. Davis, a Justice of the Peace, in and for said County, personally appeared Solomon Riggle, John Albin and William S. Albin proprietors of the foregoing town, and acknowledged the laying out to be their voluntary act and deed, thereby dedicating the streets and alleys to public use.
