

Resolved unanimously that the deficient three acre lots be made up from those already forfeited or relinquished to the company, and be drawn for & placed to the respective deficient proprietors

Resolved unanimously that in all cases where equal quantities of land are added to deficient shares of one hundred & sixty & eight acre lots, such additions shall be drawn for and bear the number of such lots as they are annexed to.

December 8th

A petition from P. Bureau, M. Burthet & Return I. Meigs Jr. in behalf of the French people at Gallipolis, praying for certain lands &c, was presented & laid upon the table for future consideration.

The report of the committee for examining the lands upon the Hockhocking suitable for fifth division lots was laid upon the Table

(Report)

We the subscribers being appointed a committee by a resolve of the agents of the Ohio Company of the 9th Nov^r 1790 and for the purpose expressed in said resolve; But being prevented from attending to that business by the Indian war until a treaty took place, since which (in company with Jeffrey Mathewson a surveyor appointed by the Superintendent of surveys) having measured & very minutely examined the lands up the Hockhocking; Report, That in Range 14th Township the 10th the following lots or mile squares, viz: No. 13, 19, 20, 25, 31 & 32 in Range 15th Township 12th lots No. 2, 3, 4, 9, 10, 17, 23 24, 30, 35 & 36 in Range 16th Township 12th lots No. 5, 12 & 18 in Range 16, Township 13th No. 13, 14, 20, 21, 26, 27, 28, 33 & 34 we find are suitable to be laid out into fifth division lots agreeably to a map herewith exhibited. Having also examined & surveyed the land at the mouth of the great Hockhocking find it very suitable for house lots and in quantity according to the map herewith exhibited

December 9th

Upon the petition of the French people at Gallipolis, unanimously resolved that fractional miles square number twenty eight & thirty four of the third Township of the fourteenth range be offered to them at one dollar & twenty five cents per acre.

December 14th

Resolved that the Superintendent of surveys be directed to make up the eight acre lots, house lots & one hundred & sixty acre lots, which are still deficient, so as to complete each of said divisions to the number of eight hundred and seventeen lots in the following manner:

For city or house lots he will lay out the unappropriated land lying on the Northeast bank of the river Muskingum from the place where the Ministry line, so called intersects it & so far up said river as will reach the eight acre lots.

Resolved unanimously that the Superintendent reserve out of such appropriation as great a width on said unappropriated land as the present reserve of the squares for Campus Martius, and from thence to the river. This piece of land is reserved for a landing place or commons forever.

Resolved unanimously that he be also directed to appropriate for the future draughts two house lots, which were reserved in square eighteen; And to divide a small square called Battle house hill into two house lots.
