Bertified Copy of Journal Entry.

At a term of the above named court begun and held at the court House in the city of Logan Ohio on the 24th day of November 1890, among other proceedings had by and before said court, on the 2nd day of December 1890, as it appears by its journal of that day, were the following, to-wit: This day this cause came on to be heard on the petition, the evidence and testimony and was submitted to the court. The court being fully advised find that the petition in this case was filed more than 40 days prior to the first day of this term of court and that due and legal notice has been given as required by law, that the petitioners are the exclusive owners of the addition set out in the petition; that the streets and alleys and public ways of said addition have not been opened improved or used; that said addition is remote from and disconnected with all other streets, alleys or ways of said Village, and that said addition is inaccessible to any public street, alley or way; that said addition is and has been used as farm property only, that all the allegations of the petition are true and that the petitioners are entitled to the relief prayed for.
